Subject: Placement of Trash Carts

Brookland City Hall has received numerous complaints about trash carts being left next to a city street for extended hours, even days or all week.

Ordinance 1991-2 Section 2, states the following: No vehicle shall be stopped NOR any other items be placed or allowed to remain so as to obstruct and ally, road, or street and SHALL not be stopped or allowed to stand within the intersections of any street, ally or road.

This is to notify all residents that leaving your trash cart next to a city street violates Ordinance 1991-2 and could result in a citation being issued. The cost of the citation could range from \$20.00 to \$40.00 plus court cost. I am asking residents to be responsible and move your trash cart away from city street right of way after the trash has been picked up. Our police officers have more important issues to deal with rather than issuing citations for trash cans left on the streets.

In advance, I would like to thank you for being courteous and moving trash carts from the street right of way.
