From the Mayor's Desk: It's hard to believe that it is already the last guarter of 2016. The year has gone by so quickly. I want to update you on the progress of 2016 projects. The Gambill Subdivision, on the north side of the city limits, was annexed into the city in 2013. Bids to install sewer to this area were opened on September 8, 2016. Seven contractors submitted bids Plumbing Gullev and Construction was the lowest qualified bidder at \$126,661.70. The bid was accepted by the Brookland City Council at the regular meeting on September 12, 2016 by a majority vote of 6 aves to 0 navs. Gulley has started ordering sewer manholes and pipe and construction is tentatively scheduled to start by October 15, 2016. Workers will be in touch with home owners in the Gambill Subdivision to locate where the sewer line is coming out of the This will determine placement of the sewer main stub out on your property, to allow residents to be able to connect to sewer services.

The new electronic water meters are in place and working. City hall will be CLOSED TWO DAYS IN OCTOBER for training on the software for the electronic meters. We will announce the dates that the office will be closed, once they're confirmed. You may have noticed a slight decrease in your utility bill. This is due to us gradually stepping the read date back in phases. Our goal is to read the meters from the 1st to the last day of the month. This will allow us to get an accurate monthly reading of the water we pump versus the water we sold. As for reading the water meters, the new system is amazing. We are able to research usage and answer customer questions, regarding their accounts. Information and readings can be acquired by looking at the meter online, as opposed to physically taking a worker off a job and having them go and look at a meter to determine if there is a leak and if the reading is correct.

Previously it would take 3½ to 5 days, in good weather to read 1,200 meters. It now takes approximately 10 minutes to request meter readings and get a file sent back with the readings. The readings are accurate, so there are no re-reads, which also saves man hours and fuel.

The Water Improvement Project, which includes a new well, tank and lines has been submitted to the Arkansas Department of Health (ADH) for review. This project is being funded by the two-cent sales tax approved by voters last November. The review could take anywhere from three to five weeks. There was a two month set back. due to the ADH requiring a depth of 720' for the test well. The well drilling contractor asked for a change in depth, because they felt that we would have a dry well at 720'. Plans were resubmitted and the depth was changed. When the test well was drilled, they hit water at 280'. This saved the city, tens of thousands of dollars on the test well. Once approval is obtained by ADH. Civil Engineering Associates will advertise for bids on the project.

I want to update residents on sidewalk improvements in our city. The City of Brookland is in the final stage of approval to build a sidewalk to connect Brookland Elementary to the new Brookland Middle School. With the addition of this sidewalk, all three campuses will be accessible by walking safely on a sidewalk.

The City of Brookland has been awarded \$106,000.00 grant of a \$132,625.00 sidewalk project that will build a sidewalk on the west side of Holman (aka Hwy 49-B) from the Brookland Police Station, north to School Street. As many of you know, there are several pedestrians that walk this section of highway, which has no shoulder, making for a dangerous situation.

This will be the last news letter for 2016. Holidays are ahead, which include Halloween, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas and the New Year. Cooler weather and the

holiday season makes this an exciting time of the year.

This year, in November, our country will elect a new president. Please remember to get out and vote. There are many countries that only dream of being able to elect their leader. This is one the greatest freedoms we have, as Americans. May God Bless Our Country, Our City and Our Troops around the world who are protecting this freedom.
