From the Mayor's Desk:

The first quarter of 2016 is in the books, and with the arrival of spring and better weather conditions, the city has started working on various projects.

A new sidewalk from School Street south along Oak Street to W Matthews is just about complete.

Workers are laying the sod and finishing up this project. Our next sidewalk will be installed from Brookland Elementary to the new Brookland Middle School on North Oak. City of Brookland was awarded a Safe Routes To School 80/20 matching grant for the installation.

The water improvement project is proceeding as planned. Test well drilling was delayed thirty days due to a difference in geological that information Arkansas Department of Health has and information well drillers had. Test drill specifications were changed and newspaper ads have been run again, requesting bids. The test well should be done late April early May. Electronic-read water meters (ERWM) have been ordered and will start being installed over the next three months. ERWM will help us serve our customers you, consistently, and will allow utility department personnel to notify you of high water usage the day it occurs. This will help reduce the cost to you the customer, while keeping the cost of overall operation down, by reducing cost of electricity, chemicals and man hours. The ability to read the ERWM on the same day of each month will mean consistent water bills. It takes three to four utility workers an average of three to four days, to read all the water meters on our water system. An additional 1 to 2 days can be added to this process if the weather is bad. Electronic-read

water meters will allow the water clerk to read 1,200 plus water meters from the office, in an average of 15 minutes.

As a First Class City, and as Mayor, by state law, I have to give a State of the City address. On my first attempt last month. I tried to cover the new businesses. expansions of current business and the revitalization of the downtown area on Holman. I was told once by a wise gentleman; if you thank someone and/or bring recognition to someone, try to not leave anyone out. You guessed it. I did miss some businesses that should have been mentioned. I apologize for that and would like to recognize them now. Black Iron Shooting Range located at 622 Holman has an indoor shooting range, archery range and sells guns and ammo. Co-owners Aaron Coleman and Steve Mobbs operate Black Iron and have done a lot of work in 2015 to promote their business in Brookland. Aaron told me they now have over 1,000 patrons that use Black Iron Indoor Shooting Range. Black Iron allows the Brookland Police Department to use the facility for firearm certification, at no charge. When traveling, I have had people as far away as Little Rock, Conway, and Hot Springs that have said they have been in northeast Arkansas on business. and visited Black Iron. We appreciate their support of the city. If you have not visited their facility, do so. You will be impressed with Black Iron Shooting Range. Other businesses in the city that have had growth include: Props Plus, Brooks Golf Cart, Pigtails & Blue Jeans. Brookland Market. Brookland Sales, Kum & Go, Micro Wire Form, Brookland Auto Sales, Gulley Plumbing and Construction, LaCascada Mexican Restaurant, Wayne's Auto and Tire. Red Roof Mini Storage, and McCarty Rental Storage. If you

own a business and would like to put an article in our quarterly newsletter, we invite you to do so. Let the citizens know about your business, where it is located and what it has to offer. Our next quarterly newsletter will be released July 1, 2016.

Grass cutting season has come early this year due to the mild winter. Officers will be monitoring yards for compliance with tall grass issues, unsightly conditions, vehicles parked in streets, and other non-compliance code enforcement complaints.

The addition of new sidewalks will make areas safer for citizens to walk. However, there are many areas where there are NO sidewalks and pedestrians will still be walking along side city streets. Please use caution while driving the streets this summer and let's keep all of our citizens safe. Watch out for children on bicycles as well.

Swimming pools will soon be put up and filled with water. Please see article in this newsletter regarding specifications on fencing.
